

## **An Overview of the Integrated Health for All Foundation (IHAF) Cameroon in the year 2010**

Distinguished guest and dear friends,

Having heard much about the Integrated Health for All Foundation, may we now settle down on the operation of the Foundation in the year 2010.

### **PART I: GUEST, INTERNSHIP AND VOLUNTEERS**

From January 1<sup>st</sup> 2010 to December 31<sup>st</sup> 2010 our HQ Secretariat received:

#### **A. Guests:**

110	Female guest and
94	Male guest

Making a total of 204 guests with diversified purposes but which could be grouped into the following categories:

110 guests	inquired about our foundation and its activities
70 guests	attended our weekly meetings
10 guests	to sign partnership agreements and
40 guests	came to visit friends and relatives.

#### **B. Internship:**

12	Applications were received from female applicants and
9	Applications were received from male applicants

Making a total of 21 applications amongst which 3 were advised to come some other time, probably because available places were already occupied.

Of the 18 recruited for the internship so far,

7	Female interns and
4	Male interns

Making a total of 11 who have successfully completed the programme and graduated.

Meanwhile

3	Female interns and
4	Male interns

Making a total of 7 are yet to complete the programme.

On the basis of the above presentation:

57	Percent of the applicants were females
67	Percent of those recruited for the internship were females and
64	Percent of the graduates were females

Thus gender is a serious consideration in IHAF and it is about time women take up their rights as shown from their performance in the programme.

### **C. Volunteers:**

5	Applications were received from female volunteers and
4	Applications were received from male volunteers

Making a total of 9 all of whom are graduates from the internship and were all recruited. Out of the nine (9), three (3) are on study leaves while 6 are in the secretariat.

We had a social outing with our partner TPS Production at the French Cultural Centre, Yaounde in witness launching of their most recent production entitled: *“La Fille du Soleil”*

Similarly we were at Hilton Hotel witnessing RENATA’s evident stories about the reality of rape and incest cases with young girls being most vulnerability

#### **PART V: PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT SIGNED IN 2010:**

We signed series of partnership agreements as per below:

On September 4<sup>th</sup> with the African Japan Forum, Japan Foundation for AIDS Prevention (AJF) done between Dr Kaouru Kawada (Representative of AJF) and Wilfred A. Abia (Chief Executive Officer of IHAF).

The agreement with the Japan Foundation for HIV prevention is focused on HIV/AIDS prevention and management of victims in Cameroon.

On July 26<sup>th</sup> with the Commonwealth Students Union (COMSU) done between Mr Njuh Louis (Founding President of COMSU) and the CEO for IHAF

The agreement focused on peer education (on HIV/AIDS amongst students and communities, personal and community hygiene) and capacity building in domains of project planning and management and leadership with joint focus on governance

On October 23<sup>rd</sup> with the Gold Star Entertainment Production (GSE) done between Mr Njeck Linus (Director of GsE) and the CEO for IHAF

On October 23<sup>rd</sup> with the Traitement des Projet Speciaux (TPS) done between Mr Tebang Francis (Director of TPS) and the CEO of IHAF

The COMSU, GsE, TPS and IHAF agreement is a 4 partner cooperation focused on poverty alleviation via promotion of talents in African youths.

On November 21<sup>st</sup> Noodles Ondus done between Dr Chiara Frazzoli (Executive Director of

with the Noodles Ondus) and the CEO of IHAF.

The agreement is focused on poverty alleviation via illustrative write-ups and textbooks via an Italian-Cameroon-Nigeria cooperation. IHAF is intervening in the domains of risk assessments and use of red palm oil.

In September with the

African Network for Drugs and Diagnostic Innovation (ANDI).

The agreement is focused on the reducing disease burdens in Africa via discovery, production and commercialization of drugs formulated and compounded by Africans and sold to Africans at low cost.

This saw IHAF's prestigious application to ANDi to be recognized as an ANDi's Centre of Excellence for health products R&D Sensitization, Monitoring & Evaluation and Risk Assessment in Africa (review process is ongoing).

## **PART VI: PROJECTS**

We did a number of feasibility studies this year, wrote and submitted three projects for funding focusing on agriculture and women empowerment; etc

A hand full of projects are under preparation amongst which is the strategic social cultural economic entertainment and development partnership on the "All African Students Entertainment Awards and Fundraising Project" which shall soon be made public on media.
